What are the responsibilities of as U.S. Senator from Pennsylvania?

- Introduce bills and resolutions, offer amendments, serve on committees
- Exclusive powers: initiate revenue bills; impeach federal officials; elect the President in the case of a tied vote in the Electoral College
- Approve appointments to the Vice Presidency
- Approve any treaty that involves foreign trade

What has this candidate done that qualifies them to be U.S. Senator from Pennsylvania?

- Education: AB, College of the Holy Cross
JD, Columbus School of Law at Catholic University of America
- Positions: Pennsylvania Auditor General, State Treasurer, and U.S. Senator (since 2006)
- Fiscal watchdog who made nursing homes safer, child care more affordable, and government more accountable
- Led the fight to reform Megan's Law to better protect Pennsylvania children and communities
- Prime Senate sponsor of landmark legislation allowing families to save for long-term care of loved ones with disabilities in a tax-advantaged savings account
- Passed the Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act which outlines steps schools can take to educate students and help prevent sexual assault, requires uniform reporting standards for sexual assaults on college campuses, and requires schools to provide clear guidelines to students on their sexual assault policies.

What are this candidate's goals if elected as U.S. Senator from Pennsylvania?

- Keep delivering results for Pennsylvania
- Advocate for children, families, and people with disabilities
- Ensure that seniors have the resources and support they need
- Stand up to powerful corporate special interests
- Work to raise wages and to create and retain jobs across Pennsylvania
- Oppose Congressional Republicans' recent attempts to give tax cuts to the ultra-rich and to undermine Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid
